- 2. H. O. Sargent Federal Agent for Agricultural Education for Negroes, suggested the forming of the National Organization of NFA.
- 3. S. B. Simmons Supervisor of Vocational Agriculture and State NFA Advisor of North Carolina, instrumental in the organizing of the New Farmers of North Carolina and founding father of the National Association of NFA.
- 4. J. R. Thomas Teacher-Trainer of Vocational Agriculture in Virginia, and founding father of National Association of NFA.
- 5. Arthur Floyd Itinerant Teacher-Trainer and special supervisor of Vocational Agriculture in Alabama, and founding father of the National Organization of NFA.
- 6. Lloyd J. Phipps Professor of Agricultural Education at the University of Illinois, outstanding author in the field of Agricultural Education.
- 7. Clarence E. Dean Professor of Agricultural Education at NCA&T State University, first Teacher-Trainer at NCA&T State University and instrumental in organizing teachers of agriculture in the State.
- 8. Alfred H. Krebs Professor of Agricultural Education and Vice-President at VPI, prolific writer and outstanding author.
- 9. H. M. Hamlin Professor of Vocational Education at the University of Illinois, prolific writer and outstanding author in Agricultural Education and also Consultant in the field.
- 10. Carsie Hammonds -- Professor of Agricultural Education of Kentucky, outstanding lecturer and writer in Agricultural Education.
