Subject: FROM THE PAST, WE LOOK WITH SUCCESS TO THE FUTURE

There are a number of things which we as a group have done which might be considered at the least, good. Individuals in our group have accomplished a number of things that are outstanding. We can review our record of 1942 with pride and with the hope and assurance that our 1943 record will be more serviceable, more successful and more enjoyable. As I write this communication, goveral things stand out. First, our successful Thanksgiving Program. That program has received many favorable comments. Second, our record as to the number of RWPT Courses, which is very good. We lead the state with a total of 201 courses. As good as that is, we must look forward to 1943 with a determination to do a swell job in Increasing Food Commodities, and the 20 teachers who have not conducted classes should fall in line and help to improve this phase of the program. At the present time, 77% of our men conducted classes, with an average of 3 courses per teacher. Can't you rejoice in the fact that you are a part of this successful group?

NFA QUIZ, U. S. STAMP AND BOND PROGRAM. This activity is one of great significance. The program has been discussed with a number of the teachers, all of whom have said in words, "It must and will be done." It has been endorsed by many leading citizens of the state. I wish I could give you complete details in this letter. Since that can not be done, we are arranging to make contact with the teachers through group meetings, from December 31 to January 9. This activity includes a possibility of several prizes in U. S. Bonds which your students may win. Therefore we are appealing to you, first, to be present at the group meeting, in order that you might get first hand information about the program; second, we solicit the most successful participation, to the fullest extent of every teacher. Finally, in the 182 years which I have been in this position, practically every teacher has supported in a fine way, every significant request made. This time we are out on the limb, as we have never been before, we are urgently in need of all the support we can possibly obtain, from you, your chapter and school.

REPORT ON NFA THANKSGIVING PROCEAM 1942
