Gentlement

Several of our summer workshop instructors are making every effort to organize programs that will not only give teachers some of the latest information, but also present materials in such a form that they can be readily adapted to the teachers' own instructional programs. If this extra effort on the part of the instructors is to result in improved instruction by teachers in these content areas, we should offer our support and cooperation, and encourage teachers to prepare for the workshops as suggested by the instructors.

Mr. George Jones believes that his portion of the workshop on "Diseases, Insects, Weed Control and Application Equipment" will be more effective if the teachers will do a little pre-planning and bring certain things to the workshop. The paragraphs which follow were taken from a recent letter from him.

In discussing the program to be presented at such of the workshops this summer, Mr. Stephen and Mr. Robertson proposed some ideas which could mean, we believe, a great deal to the teachers in their presentation of insect discussion work as well as the comments on control. We would like to suggest that each teacher bring to the workshop meeting place several insect specimens and while the total number is not so important, we would like to suggest somewhere from 25 to 50 different specimens. These could be from a collection, some may already have, or they can be specimens collected from crops, livestock or perhaps the household. It would be well if the specimens could be mounted and if regular insect pins are not available, the common stick pin could be used. Also, the teacher could use a cigar box for a box arrangement and in which the specimens could be kept for reference work in the classroom. We believe a discussion on care of a collection and on identification would help the teachers prepare material for classroom use.
