Purpose and Results of Visit

October 17, 1962 Winston-Salem North Carolina

The purpose of this visit was to attend and work with Mr. D. E. Smith, teacher of vocational agriculture at the Carver High School, in connection with his County Wide Agricultural Fair. This Fair appeared to be well planned and organized with different individual and community organizations participating. There were agricultural and home economics exhibits that carried educational value. The livestock appeared to show an improvement over last year. There were indications on the part of the agricultural teacher and agricultural students, both all-day boys and adults, doing a good educational job in this area.

October 18, 1962 Washington High Reidsville, N.C.

The purpose of this visit was to work with Mr. Ben S. Lee who is doing his student teaching at this center.

When I arrived I found the student teacher performing in a satisfactory manner in the department. He and the Supervising Teacher, Mr. A. N. McCoy, seemed to be working very nicely together, and there were signs of progress being made by Mr. Lee under Mr. McCoy's supervision.

Mr. Lee had been assigned the 10th and 11th grades for teaching responsibilities. The jobs taught on this day was "Feeding Hens for Egg Production." The situation surrounding his reasons for selecting this job were: 1) Six per cent of the boys have laying hens on their farms and 2) very lew boys were aware of feeding hens for egg production.

The primary objectives for teaching the job were: 1) To develop within the student the ability to feed laying hens properly, 2) to develop the ability to recognize the proper feed for laying hens, and 3) to acquaint the student with the development that can be caused by improper

October 18, 1962 (con'td) feeding. It was felt the student handled the job in a satisfactory manner, however, more teaching aids could have been used. It is also felt that the student teacher could improve on his techniques on encouraging student participation.

In conference with the student teacher, the following items were reviewed and discussed: Work Book, Schedule of Participating Experiences, Teaching Calendar, Lesson Plans and other student teaching assignments. The Supervising Teacher had very high appraisal of the trainee.

October 19, 1962 State Fair Raleigh, N. C. The purpose of this visit was to attend the State Agricultural Fair in connection with our Teacher-Education Program at the College.

The students attended and observed various aspects of the State Fair.
