Purpose and Results of the Visit

November 9, 1962 Central High Graham, N. C.

The purpose of this visit was to carry senior students in agricultural education on a field trip to study the facilities and program of vocational agriculture in this multiple teacher department.

We arrived at the school around 10:00 A.M., and found the department in operation with its instructional program. The students toured the department and studied the facilities under the direction of Messrs. Mitchell and Lanier, the teachers in the department. The program was studied by the students and explained by the teachers. The students observed in part one class on Parliamentary Procedures.

The purpose of this visit was the same as above.

The observations made by the students were similar. However, this is a single teacher department and the students were able to compare the operation of a single department with that of a multiple teacher department.
