Date and Place

Purpose and Results of the Visit

May 16, 1962 Phillips High

The purpose of this visit was to work with Mr. Alfonzia Knight who is engaged in student Battleboro, N.C. teaching at this center.

> He had been assigned two sections of the 9th grade for teaching responsibility. On this day he was teaching the boys in the classroom on "Growing Hybrid Corn." The situations surrounding his reason for teaching this job were: (1) all the boys grow corn, (2) many of the boys grow hybrid corn (3) some of the class members have never realized the value (4) in 1957, North Carolina grew 70 per cent hybrid corn.

The primary objectives for teaching the job as outlined by the trainee were: (1) To develop understandings of the importance and value of hybrid corn (2) to develop the ability to select good hybrid seed corn each year, and (3) to develop the ability to produce and care for hybrid seed corn properly and profitably.

The trainee handled the classes very well. The students were motivated and their participation was good. The trainee made use of limited visual aids.

The afternoon was spent in conference with the trainee. We reviewed and discussed the student teacher's progress, schedule of participating experiences, lesson plan, course outline, workbooks, and many other things relating to his student teaching program. strong and weak points were pointed up.

I could see progress and it is felt that this young man has good teaching potentials.

The purpose of this visit was to assist with the program of Mr. Coleman who is a new teacher at this center.

This is a multiple teacher department and the man was working on some correspondence when I

arrived. I gave him some suggestions for improving his correspondence with local and state officials as well as correspondence in other areas.

We reviewed the teacher's program including course outline, lesson plans, etc. These were discussed and suggestions offered for improvement. It was suggested that he establish measurable and attainable goals. Suggestions were offered for making more effective use of the existing facilities. The senior teacher in the department was not available.
