# PARTICIPATION IN THE ACTIVITIES OF SIMMONS FFA CAMP SWANSBORO, N. C. 1966-1967

The purpose of this summary is to give each Advisor an opportunity to compare his camping participation in 1966 against 1967. We hope that you will check to see what your Chapter did, and what your group did; then discuss it with your Chapter members, your adult classes, church and other civic groups, with the hope of getting the group, or groups to give "campships" to those members who excel in the total program.

If the idea is accepted by the civic groups, then the Chapter may work out a score card that would give the FFA members credit for outstanding work done in other award programs, or the total program of activities. For example:

- 1. Give points for the various Supervised Practice activities
- 2. Give points for Home Improvement, Public Speaking, etc.
- 3. Give points for holding Chapter offices, serving on Committees, etc.

Have members of your Chapter work out the details, and the member (or members) receiving the highest points will receive an expense-free week at camp - sponsored by one of the groups named.
