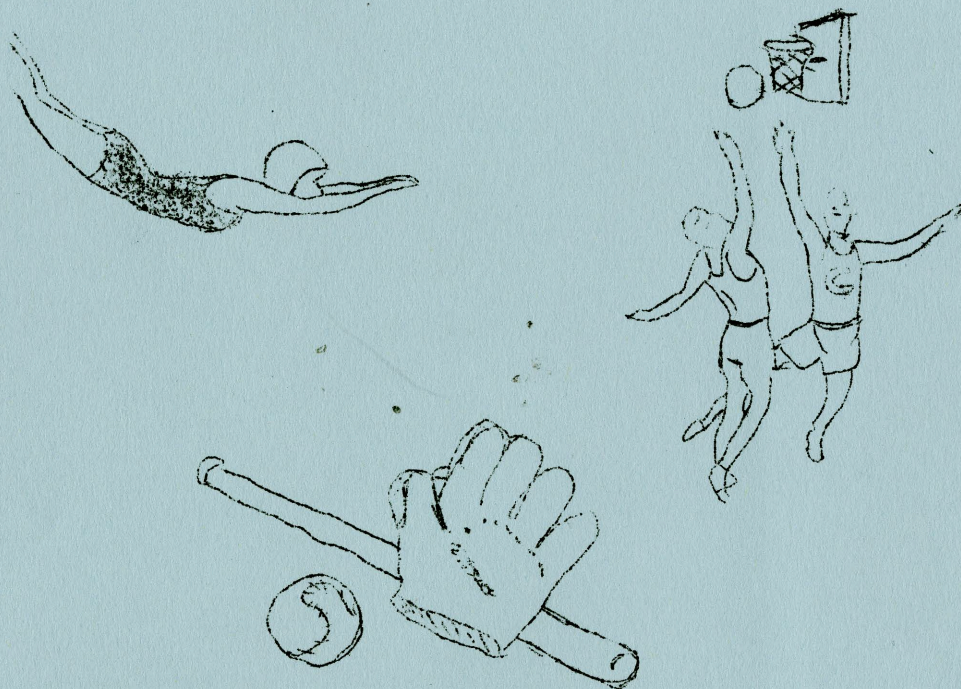

The purpose of this summary is to give each Advisor an opportunity to compare his camping participation over the last three years. We hope you will check to see what your Chapter did, and what your group did; then discuss it with your Chapter members, your adult classes, church and other civic groups in the hope of securing aid to send more worthy FFA members to camp. If the idea is accepted by the civic groups, then the Chapter may work out a score card that would give the FFA members credit for outstanding work done.

In studying the summary it is interesting to see how the number attending varied from school to school and from year to year. Can you analyze your own school and try to improve its record? Every Advisor should see to it that a representative group attends one of the camps each year.

Do not wait for a 1970 camp schedule to start making plans for your camping for the summer of 1970. It is hoped that this will be a part of the Chapter's annual program-of-work; and we suggest that a goal should be set at the beginning of the year as to the number of members you expect to send to camp. If you have enough boys to maintain a department, you certainly have enough boys to attend camp; and it seems that the ninth and tenth graders should be good prospects because for the most part, those boys are not old enough to hold down regular jobs. I hope you will analyze the trend that is taking place in our camp attendance, and see if you can make an adjustment in this connection.
