Our State Organization has made only two honorary members and these were made at the Annual Meeting April 8, 1932, Dr. F. D. Bluford, President of the A. and T. College, and Professor Chas. Moore, the gentleman who played the major part in having the A. and T. College located in Greensboro, N. C. These members are not included in the figures given above.

OBJECTIVES ACCOMPLISHED

1. STATE CAMP-----The Third Camp went over big last week.

The chief feature this year was the Warren County "Vo-Ag" Picnic. There were more than 1500 vocational agricultural pupils, their parents friends, county, and State Officials present for this affair. The picnic was sponsored by the fifty-two (52) agricultural graduates from the two schools within the county.
2. "3 to 1" CORN BANQUET-----This was our third affair of this nature. There were 153 persons present for the affair. John Allen Spaulding, the highest producer in the Contest for the past two years was elected a delegate to the Maryland meeting largely because of his success in this objective.
3. SUPPLIES FOR THE NEEDY-----For the second time our State Organization sponsored this objective. More than \$3,000.00 worth of food was turned over to the needy families through the various relief agencies throughout the State.
4. STATE MEETING AND CONTESTS-----All of our chapters took part in the State Meeting except two. Twenty-two chapters took part in the Essay Contest. Our Annual Meeting was by far the most enjoyable we have ever had.
5. LOCAL CHAPTER OBJECTIVES-----According to reports made at the State Meeting all chapters were successful in putting over the State Objectives.
