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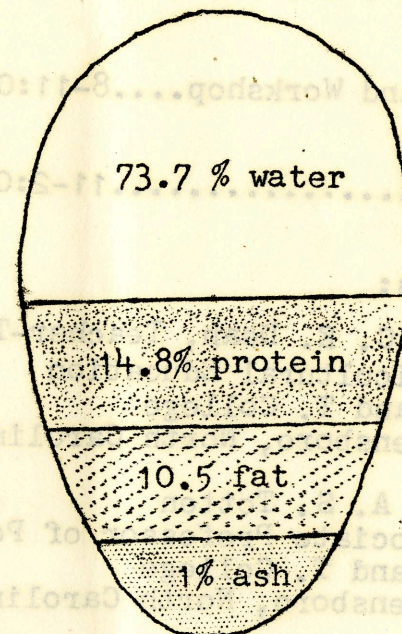
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## RULES AND REGULATIONS

5. Class members may exhibit one or more dozen of egg entries.
6. Prizes will be given to ranking contestants.
7. Sweepstake prize will be given to the individual with the highest number of points.
8. Every entry will receive a ribbon (Danish System) Blue, three points; Red, two points; and White, one point.
