Dear Sir:

Replying to your letter of June the 8th, I wish to say that I do hope that the school officials of Wake County will not see fit to move one of the vocational teachers from Method to Zebulon. That statement has nothing to do with the individuals. I have reference to the appropriation. It seems to me that the Negro farmers of Wake County are in sufficient number to warrant the full time of three vocational teachers. To move this appropriation in my judgment would be a means of reducing the program at Method. If the same is done, it would certainly cause some unfriendly feelings.

I was hoping I would get some information on this subject last Friday, but Mr. Thomas and Lockhardt were out of the city. I expect to take this matter up with them on the 29th of the month. I hope to see you while in Raleigh.
