Replying to your letter of June the Sth, I wish to say that I do hope that the school officials of Wake County will not see fit to move one of the vocational teachers from Method to Zebulon. That statement has nothing to do with the individuals. I have reference to the appropriation. It seems to me that the Negro farmers of Wake County are in sufficient number to warrent the full time of three vocational teachers. To move this appropriation in my judgment would be a means of reducing the program at Method. If the same is done, it would certainly cause some unfriendly feelings.
